INSTRUCTIONS CONCERNING FIRE DRILL

1944-45

1. Each pupil should know what to do and where to go.
2. Everyone must leave the building - students, teachers, assistants, custodians, secretaries.
3. Everyone must walk as fast as possible without pushing or crowding.
4. All fire plugs must be cleared by at least 30 feet. Those people who go out the North and South doors to the West, go east of the fire-plugs.
5. If there are two doors to a room and you are to go out a North main door, use the North door from the room only. That is, in the case of two doors use the one closer to the exit.
6. Those going into the court, walk on east and 30 feet away from the rear of the auditorium.
7. Those going out to the West or to the North, go to the road, but do not cross it.
8. When going into the hall stay next to the wall on your side. Do not cross the hall.
9. Last person out please shut doors.
10. All classroom doors and windows must be shut quickly by the teacher or by an appointed pupil.
11. Please do not walk on the grass.
12. Discuss the proper fire exit with each of your classes.

7. Reports of out-of-school activities, assemblies, and class, club, council, etc., sponsorship. Include minutes of important meetings.
8. These reports should be submitted to the Principal's office, please.
