 5. If there are two doors to a room and you are to go out a North main door, use the North door from the room only. That is, in the case of two doors use the one closer to the exit.
 6. Those going into the court, walk on east and 30 feet away from the rear of the auditorium.
 7. Those going out to the West or to the North, go to the road, but do not cross it.
 8. When going into the hall stay next to the wall on your side. Do not cross the hall.
 9. Last person out please shut doors.
 10. All classroom doors and windows must be shut quickly by the teacher or by an appointed pupil.
 11. Please do not walk on the grass.
 12. Discuss the proper fire exit with each of your classes.

The purpose of this method is to encourage all employees to submit suggestions concerning new methods, techniques, or procedures which may be adopted to increase efficiency, reduce costs, or improve the quality of work. Employees are invited to submit their suggestions to the Personnel Officer, Washington Office, or to any supervisor, or to the Director of Operations, Washington Office, or to the Director of the Activity which they are employed.

Suggestions may be of the following nature: (1) Improvement of working conditions, practices or procedures; (2) suggestion of new methods, devices or utilization of existing methods for improvement of the quality of work; (3) reduction of administrative expenses by personnel; (4) increase the scope of services rendered, such as office cleaning, telephone, presentation of a personnel grievance, etc.; (5) classification matter of any kind which may constitute a suggestion.

Employees may submit suggestions to their immediate supervisor or to the Director of Operations. Suggestions may be submitted to the Director of Operations "Suggestion Department" of the Intergovernmental Relations Division. Employees may drop their suggestions in the "Suggestion Boxes" which will be located in the lobby of the Personnel Office. It will be the responsibility of the Personnel Officer or the Field Officer to provide "Suggestion Boxes" and to display prominently the posters furnished by the Washington Office. The suggested collection boxes monthly.
