I found here no ~~parts~~ furniture  
except Bedding (of course no table no  
chair) I wish if you could help me

over in my apartment 11K-12C.  
Please just imagine how awful  
without those things in the room.  
First, my wife insist to take with ~~us~~  
us, but I said this is furnished.  
Here our argument starting every  
morning, we have no place to write the  
letter, no place to dispose anything.  
I just write this letter on the suits  
case.

My wife and myself (especially my wife)  
are much appreciated if you kindly  
help us at this time.

I just arrived here on Oct 15,

I myself understand this is a temporary  
I went to Los Angeles every day and  
try to find out housing its almost  
hopeless, I am trying to get into  
business in near future if I  
have the chance but I don't know yet  
what line get into. I telephoned to

over everything about Center and
